

Equine Influenza Vaccination Certificates

All horses, ponies and donkeys entering the Showground must be vaccinated according to the requirements below, and vaccination certificates/passports must accompany the horse or pony to the Show and available for checking at any time whilst on the Showground.

Horses Competing at FEI events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

There will be no tolerance of Equine Influenza Vaccination Certificates that do not meet the Show protocol, as seen below. If discrepancies are found, this will result in the horse being sent home immediately, without competing and/or any prizes will be forfeited.

Horses, ponies and donkeys must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 - 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 - 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose.

Horses, ponies and donkeys must have been vaccinated within 6 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.

Foals

In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born.

Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course.

Please note that neither vaccination certificates nor passports should be sent to the Show Office prior to the event. However, random checks will be carried out on the Showground.
